Children and young people are being encouraged to go along to their local library and register for this year's 'Ready, Set, Read' Summer Reading Challenge. The theme of the challenge this year – 'Ready, Set, Read!' – is about reading, sport and play, and aims to keep children's minds and bodies active over the summer break.


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**CLASS NOVELS**
